Programs offered/projects under way

The BSFS currently has two major sites of operation.

- ♦ The "Drury House" and the Classroom/Meeting building, located on a parcel of land leased from the U. S. Army Corps of Engineers within the Missouri Department of Conservation Drury Conservation Area and has undergone complete renovations. We now have a solar power system to

provide all electrical power. The Drury House has 10 beds. A new research wet laboratory is under construction and should be completed by winter 2010.

- ♦ The "Mincy House" is located adjacent to the Drury Conservation Area. This house provides 10 beds for overnight accommodations for faculty and graduate student researchers, classes, workshops, and regional meetings that focus on area ecosystems. The vision for future expansion includes the construction of a dormitory / education center.

BSFS serves as a locality for field trips, retreats and small meetings. Space is also available for limited camping. The BSFS periodically issues a newsletter available electronically or by mail. Contact CelestePrussia@missouristate.edu to request your addition to the mailing list.

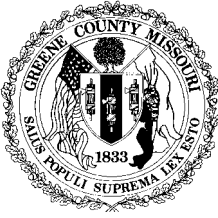

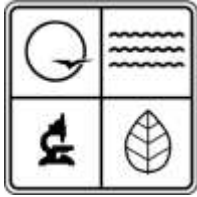

Lake Springfield - The 158-acre park is currently open every day, sunrise to sunset. There is pavilion/picnic area with playground equipment available (first-come basis). The area has both open, grassy spaces and wooded areas (home to a variety of wildlife and birds) and borders the north shore of Lake Springfield. A special use area, The Northwoods Pavilion, can be reserved for group activities (contact 891-1550). The property has a 4,000-square-foot Boathouse and Marina with a 1,450-square-foot deck area overlooking the lake. The building also has a community meeting room, a warming kitchen, retail shop with canoe and kayak rentals and public restrooms. The community meeting room features an expanse of glass with views across the deck to the

lake. The park ties into the James River Linear Park Trail, has a greenway trail and hiking trail throughout the property.

Valley Water Mill Park & Equestrian Center - The 90-acre property features a lake and new fishing piers, 1,500-square-foot outdoor Learning Pavilion with a fireplace and restrooms. Surrounding the lake is a walking trail and lakeside learning stations, where visitors can take advantage of the outdoor classroom setting for instruction. An Equestrian Center is also planned for the property. It will incorporate an existing instructional barn, outdoor riding ring and stables for equestrian clinics and seminars, as well as offering "open riding" for area horse owners when the 52-acre portion of the property opens. Future plans include addition of a riding academy with introductory-level instruction for children and youth.

Onsite Wastewater Remediation and Septic Database Project (319) *Main goals:* Cost share with individuals to remediate failing septic systems, provide water quality education (through news, workshops, media, printed), develop database for better service of onsite wastewater treatment systems in local county (Stone). We have been working with the Stone County Health Department to implement a new database which will be linked to the Stone County plats map which is currently viewed on their website. This database will allow the public to better track their septic systems and the department to service they advanced systems which require maintenance on a regular basis in order to continue to operate properly and protect water quality. We have worked with over 13 homeowners to help remediate their failing septic systems by cost-sharing up to 50% of the new system replacement. We have been hosting workshops including one coming up in September 21st 2010 for septic installers at the Onsite Training Center in Springfield which is an excellent opportunity to showcase this new facility to the region's installers, soils evaluators and service providers. We also plan to host homeowner workshops to help educate the local public on wastewater and water quality issues.

Watershed Management Plans for Eastern and Western Table Rock Lake (319): *Time frame:* July 15, 2010 to January 1, 2012—*Main goals:* Develop a

watershed management that is practical, contains a timeline and includes 9 key elements as outlined by the EPA for WMP development. This project will host a series of meetings to help glean insight and input from the local community around Table Rock Lake on the subjects of water quality conservation and Lake-friendly development practices. This will assist in producing a plan that will be feasible, practical and achieve community support and buy-in for protecting water quality in Table Rock Lake.

Shoreline Cleanups: Table Rock Lake Shoreline Cleanup: We organize a spring Table Rock Lake cleanup on the first Saturday in April which usually has 800 to 1000 participants and another Table Rock cleanup in the fall that has around 250 volunteers. The yearly reported trash removal from the Lake shoreline cleanup cleanups is approximately 14 tons. Area businesses, the Corps of Engineers and the Marina Association help sponsor this effort. Taneycomo Cleanup: This year (2010) we are organizing a cleanup on Lake Taneycomo in which we are expecting local boat rentals and volunteers to donate their equipment and time to achieve a successful event. Again, local businesses are helping sponsor this event. This cleanup will be September 18th and we hope to get about 200 volunteers, though that number may be exceeded.

Septic Pumpout Program/remediation project (MDC): Main goals: Cost share with individuals to remediate failing septic systems, and by providing rebate and education program for septic tank pump-outs.

Lake Smart Living Project (319): Time frame: July 2011 to July 2015—Main goals: Implement low-impact development including vegetative buffers as demonstration projects for public education, create Lake Smart program for area residents to implement water quality conservation practices on their own.

Educational Presentations for all age groups: Education Outreach Director, Tammy Yelden, has developed educational presentations for both school classrooms and public presentations. The Biomonitoring Lab is very popular with students because they get to solve a simulated pollution problem with live aquatic macroinvertebrates. Activities are also used from the WET and WOW programs. Public presentations cover many different topics catering to the Ozarks area.
