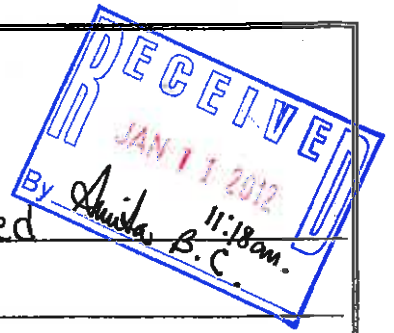

Views & Visions

A myriad of Springfield residents, including the media, business professionals, and Missouri State University college students, have encouraged me to be a presence on the City of Springfield City Council.

I am consistently and regularly sought out by KOLR 10 and Springfield 33 for views concerning alcohol-related subjects. I have considerable experience appearing as a concerned citizen before the City Council regarding the underage drinking issue, offering advice about the creation of relevant laws, and providing the City of Springfield Police Department with ideas pertinent to the issue.

Untold students from Missouri State University look to me as the voice of young adults. My desire is to increase cooperation between the University and the City, including the Police Department. Students from the University contribute greatly to the economic health of area businesses, and therefore the City of Springfield, a fact that should be recognized and respected.

Another aspiration is for the City of Springfield to increase employment and business growth. This can be accomplished by encouraging individuals to become entrepreneurs, perform new business startups, and begin filling the large amount of vacant stores in Springfield. In addition, the City should be focused on decreasing the unemployment rate by seeking and securing outside industries to locate to Springfield.

I envision the City of Springfield working hand-in-hand with those involved in the government-related programs offered by Missouri State University. Together, students could be encouraged to attend City Council meetings, learn how the local government works, get involved in local government, and change their voting registration to Springfield.

I would like to see the City Fathers encouraging everyone to register to vote and get involved. As a bar owner and bartender for fifteen years, I have listened to so many people stating that they don't get involved because they don't believe their vote counts. An effort should be made by the City to ensure everyone knows that each vote does count. Personally, I would like to see the Constitution changed so that voting takes place over a one-week period versus one day. In addition, I would like to see a sticker placed on a Voter Identification Card and on the Driver's License, denoting that the individual voted. Then, voting could be encouraged. For example, if a police officer pulls a vehicle over for a taillight issue and discovers the person has not voted, the police officer can follow the individual to the polls, and in exchange for voting, the person would not receive a ticket for the taillight.

As a Councilmember, I would ensure the City remains in touch with the common man who has common sense, instead of someone with only educated sense.

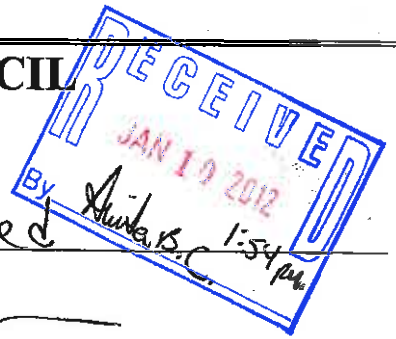



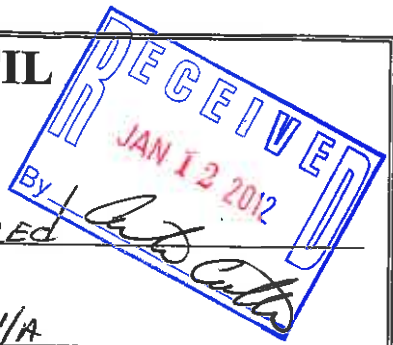
