A RESOLUTION

1 AUTHORIZING the City Manager, or his designee, to apply for a Youth Homeless
2 Demonstration Program Grant from the Department of Housing and
3 Urban Development, for a minimum amount of \$1,000,000, for the

5 plan to end youth homelessness.

8 WHEREAS, in 2010, the Opening Doors: Federal Strategic Plan to End
9 Homelessness set the goal of ending youth homelessness by 2020; and

11 WHEREAS, the Department of Housing and Urban Development (“HUD”) has an
12 initiative called the ‘Youth Homelessness Demonstration Program’ that awards grant
13 funds to assist communities in identifying strategies to attain this goal; and

15 WHEREAS, if awarded, a Youth Homeless Demonstration Program Grant could
16 be used by the City and its partner agencies to develop and implement a coordinated
17 community plan to end youth homelessness; and

19 WHEREAS, the City would partner with the local Continuum of Care, d/b/a The
20 Ozarks Alliance to End Homelessness, in carrying out all of the grant activities; and

22 WHEREAS, it is anticipated that the City will be the grant applicant and
23 Community Partnership of the Ozarks will be the lead agency; and

25 WHEREAS, the Department of Housing and Urban Development will provide
26 grant funding to our community based on our poverty rate and youth population, and, as
27 part of this grant, a national technical assistance provider will assist in development of a
28 coordinated community plan to end youth homelessness.

30 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF
31 SPRINGFIELD, MISSOURI, as follows, that:

33 Section 1 – The City Manager, or his designee, is hereby authorized to apply for
34 a Youth Homeless Demonstration Program Grant from the Department of Housing and
35 Urban Development, in a minimum amount of \$1 million, to develop and implement a

36 coordinated community plan to end youth homelessness.





ORIGINATING DEPARTMENT: Planning and Development Department

PURPOSE: Authorizing the City Manager, or his designee, to apply for a Youth Homeless Demonstration Program Grant from the Department of Housing and Urban Development, for a minimum amount of \$1,000,000, to develop and implement a coordinated community plan to end youth homelessness.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION: In 2010, the Opening Doors: Federal Strategic Plan to End Homelessness set the goal of ending youth homelessness by 2020. The Youth Homeless Demonstration Program grant funding will assist communities in identifying strategies to attain this goal. This grant, if awarded, will be used to develop and implement a coordinated community plan to end youth homelessness. The City will partner with the local Continuum of Care DBA Ozarks Alliance to End Homelessness in carrying out all of the grant activities. The City of Springfield will be the applicant, and Community Partnership of the Ozarks will be the lead agency. If Springfield is chosen, the Department of Housing and Urban Development ("HUD") will provide grant funding to our community based upon our poverty rate and youth population. As part of this grant, a national technical assistance provider will assist in development of a coordinated community plan to end youth homelessness.

REMARKS: The City submitted a grant application in 2017 and 2018 for this same grant but did not receive funding. Access to this grant funding would assist the Ozarks Alliance to End Homelessness in meeting its goal of preventing and ending youth homelessness.


