

EXPLANATION TO COUNCIL BILL 2020-195

ORIGINATING DEPARTMENT: Planning and Development

PURPOSE: Establishing the Forward SGF Downtown - Advisory Team for the purpose of providing additional citizen engagement and participation during the comprehensive planning process. (Staff recommends approval).

BACKGROUND INFORMATION: As part of the Forward SGF Comprehensive Planning process, a separate plan will be developed for downtown Springfield, broadly described as the traditional central business district, University Plaza and Jordan Valley Park. This plan is intended to replace the 1998 Vision 20/20 Center City plan. Citizen engagement will be a key factor in updating the strategic plan, including the establishment of an advisory team that will work with the City's consultants and staff over the course of the next 6-8 months.

REMARKS: The Advisory Team will provide a public face to the planning process and demonstrate a commitment on behalf of the City to seek meaningful input from citizens most familiar with the business, real estate and residential dynamics in downtown. In addition, representatives from the Planning and Zoning Commission and the Forward SGF Advisory Team will serve on the Downtown team to provide continuity. The Team will serve as a community sounding board, to help provide planning direction and feedback for Planning and Zoning Commission and City Council consideration.




