55 by the City in delivering services pursuant to the Contract will need to be transferred to the

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58 WHEREAS, certain property held by the City will need to be transferred to the United

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61 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF
62 SPRINGFIELD, MISSOURI, as follows, that:
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64 Section 1 – The City Manager, the Acting City Manager, or his designee, is hereby
65 authorized to do all things necessary for the United Way to assume ownership and
66 management of the Program, including, without limitation, providing the United Way monies
67 allocated in the City of Springfield Fiscal Year 2018-2019 budget for the Program in an
68 amount not to exceed \$125,575; assigning or subcontracting the contract between the City
69 and the Board regarding the receipt and use of grant funds by the City for the Program to
70 the United Way; transferring to the United Way for use by the Program the balance of such
71 grant funds remaining after payment of all costs incurred by the City in delivering services
72 pursuant to the contract with the Board; transferring any equipment, supplies, documents,
73 and other property held by the City for use by the Program; and executing any other
74 contracts or legal documents necessary to carry out the intent of this Ordinance, provided
75 that such contracts or documents are approved as to form by the City Attorney.
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77 Section 2 – This matter constitutes an emergency in that it relates to the immediate
78 preservation of public health and safety pursuant to Section 2.12(1) of the City Charter due
79 to the fact that the next class of the Program is scheduled for July 12, 2018; therefore, this
80 Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after passage.

EXPLANATION TO COUNCIL BILL 2018- 182

ORIGINATING DEPARTMENT: City Council

PURPOSE: To authorize the City Manager, Acting City Manager, or designee to do all things necessary to have the United Way of the Ozarks assume ownership and management of the Give 5 program, including, without limitation, providing the United Way unencumbered monies allocated in the City of Springfield Fiscal Year 2018-2019 budget for the Give 5 program up to \$125,575; assigning or subcontracting the contract between the City and the Greene County Senior Citizens' Services Fund Board regarding the receipt and use of grant funds by the City for the Give 5 program to the United Way of the Ozarks; transferring to the United Way of the Ozarks for use by the Give 5 program the balance of such grant funds remaining after payment of all costs incurred by the City in delivering services pursuant to the contract with the Greene County Senior Citizens' Services Fund Board; transferring any equipment, supplies, documents and other property held by the City for use by the Give 5 program; executing any other contracts or legal documents necessary to carry out the intent of this Ordinance; and declaring an emergency pursuant to City Charter Section 2.12.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION: The Give 5 program (the "Program") promotes civic engagement within the community by matching retired, or almost retired, volunteers with innovative volunteer opportunities. The program connects volunteers with opportunities to utilize their skills and assets to give back to their community and fill a wide variety of volunteer needs, such as providing leadership to nonprofits, mentoring children, assisting those most in need, and serving on City and County boards and commissions.

The City desires for the Program to continue, and the United Way of the Ozarks ("United Way") has agreed to continue to operate this important community program. The City has budgeted \$125,575 for the Program in the City's Fiscal Year 2018-2019 budget and desires to provide one-time unencumbered funds from this amount to the United Way as consideration for United Way's assumption of ownership and management of the Program. Additionally, the Greene County Senior Citizens' Services Fund Board ("Board") awarded the City grant funds in the amount of \$92,350 for the Program which were accepted and appropriated by the City in Special Ordinance 27011 on February 26, 2018. The City and the Board executed a contract regarding the provision and use of said grant funds on March 16, 2018, ("Contract") and such Contract needs to be assigned or subcontracted to the United Way. Furthermore, the balance of grant funds remaining after payment of all costs incurred by the City in delivering services pursuant to the Contract needs to be transferred to the United Way for use by the Program. Finally, certain property, including logo shirts, brochures, a laptop, and a projector, held by the City will need to be transferred to the United Way to operate the Program
