Partnership for Sustainability, Harry Cooper Host Light Bulb Exchange

The Partnership for Sustainability is partnering with Harry Cooper Supply to offer a one-to-one Compact Fluorescent Light (CFL) bulb exchange on Saturday, April 16. Families can bring up to 5 incandescent bulbs to trade even for up to 5 CFL bulbs.

15w CFLs are equivalent to 60w bulbs, but use 75% less energy and last 5 times longer. For example, 5 CFLs used an average of 5 hours per day will save almost \$1,000 over the life of the bulbs.

Bulbs will be available in a convenient drive-thru on the west side of the Discovery Center (located at 438 E St. Louis St.) or inside the Discovery Center from 9-5 or while supplies last. Those without a bulb to exchange can earn one by visiting five vendor booths promoting green products and services inside the Center.

Also on April 16, Partnership for Sustainability is sponsoring a free day at the Discovery Center, and hosting the 41st Annual Earth Day Celebration with Springfield/Greene County Choose Environmental Excellence.

Families will enjoy the free day at Discovery Center, an interactive, hands-on science center for all ages, committed to inspiring people of all ages with a life-long love of learning and appreciation of the world we live in and our place in it.
