_____ **Housing Code Violations** (occupied homes with visual exterior deficiencies or safety considerations on the interior or exterior)

_____ **Front-Yard Parking** (Illegal to park a vehicle or trailer in the front yard of private property. Front yard is considered the area of land that faces a street in front of the house. If a corner lot and faces two streets, then both sides are considered front yard.)

_____ **Inoperable or Abandoned Vehicles** (A vehicle that does not have a valid license plate or is not in operating condition may be considered an inoperable vehicle and must be stored in a garage or suitable enclosed building.)

_____ **Insects** (Empty any container that allows water to pool, change water in birdbaths, fountains,

potted plant trays, etc. at least once a week. Keep swimming pools treated and circulating and rain gutters free of debris.)

_____ **Noise** *(A noise violation could be continuous and frequent barking from dogs, loud or disturbing noise from a residence or vehicle, or loud and continuous noise from construction sites or commercial vehicles.)*

_____ **Sidewalks** *(Grass and weeds on sidewalks are the responsibility of the homeowner. Sidewalks cannot be blocked and must be kept open for traffic.)*

_____ obstruction _____ disrepair

_____ **Streets** *(Potholes or a street that needs repair; problems with traffic signals; sight interference at an intersection; or a street sign that is damaged or missing.)*

_____ **Trash** *(Accumulation of trash (furniture, appliances, tires, scrap metal, debris, etc.) and solid waste is prohibited.)*

_____ **Trees** *(The City will maintain trees on City property or on the City right-of-way. Trees on private property are the responsibility of the property owner. Concerns about trees on private property that interfere with electric, telephone or cable lines need to be addressed to the appropriate utility company.)*

_____ **Zoning** *(Examples: more than three unrelated people living together; illegal use of property such as a business in a residential area; or the illegal storage or parking of a vehicle used for commercial purposes.)*
