"Rollin' Stolen" making an impact in property crime solvability

The Property Section of the Springfield Police Department's Criminal Investigations Division has been maintaining and updating a target list of criminals heavily involved in property crimes in Springfield since 2013. The list, which was named "Rollin' Stolen" at the suggestion of a detective, contained the names of the



selected criminals, along with information such as their physical descriptions, addresses, associates, types of crimes committed and their vehicles. The list was made available electronically to officers in the field so they might be aware of active criminals and assist with proactive enforcement actions.

The Greene County Prosecuting Attorney's Office has been very cooperative by promptly reviewing and filing cases against these suspects as quickly as possible. Throughout 2014, 38 new people appeared on the list. By the end of the year, 34 of these individuals had criminal charges filed against them in Greene County, three had criminal charges submitted by detectives but not yet filed by prosecutors, and one had no charges submitted against him in Greene County but had multiple felony charges filed against him in other counties. Seven of these individuals were in the Missouri Department of Corrections by the end of 2014, and 13 others were in the Greene County Jail awaiting their court dates.

Due to its obvious success, detectives will continue this proactive initiative of keeping career criminals off the streets to curb property crime in Springfield.


