


TRAFFIC CALMING MEDIAN ARTWORK TEMPLATE



The SGF Yields pedestrian safety program has identified a need for pedestrian safety improvements in the Grant Beach neighborhood. The installation of traffic calming medians and enhanced crosswalks are planned to help kids and adults safely cross busy Grant Avenue.

Two medians will be installed at Grant Avenue and Calhoun Street, near the Boys and Girls Club, with two more to be installed near the entrance to Grant Beach Park, at Grant Avenue and Lynn Street.

To remind drivers that they are traveling through a neighborhood, the four medians will feature artwork by local artists: **Young and old, novice and established!** Neighbors, students, artists, individuals and groups are encouraged to get creative and submit their design proposals to Public Works. Use the template, below, to sketch out your ideas. Larger median templates available to groups and classrooms upon request.



DESIGN GUIDELINES:

- Consider large-scale patterns that are attractive for neighborhood setting, but not distracting to pedestrians and drivers.
- Avoid too much detail as it may be difficult for painting teams to replicate.
- Please incorporate "safety yellow" in your color palette to match pedestrian crossing traffic signs.
- A 6-inch "safety yellow" outline is required around all medians to increase motorist visibility.
