

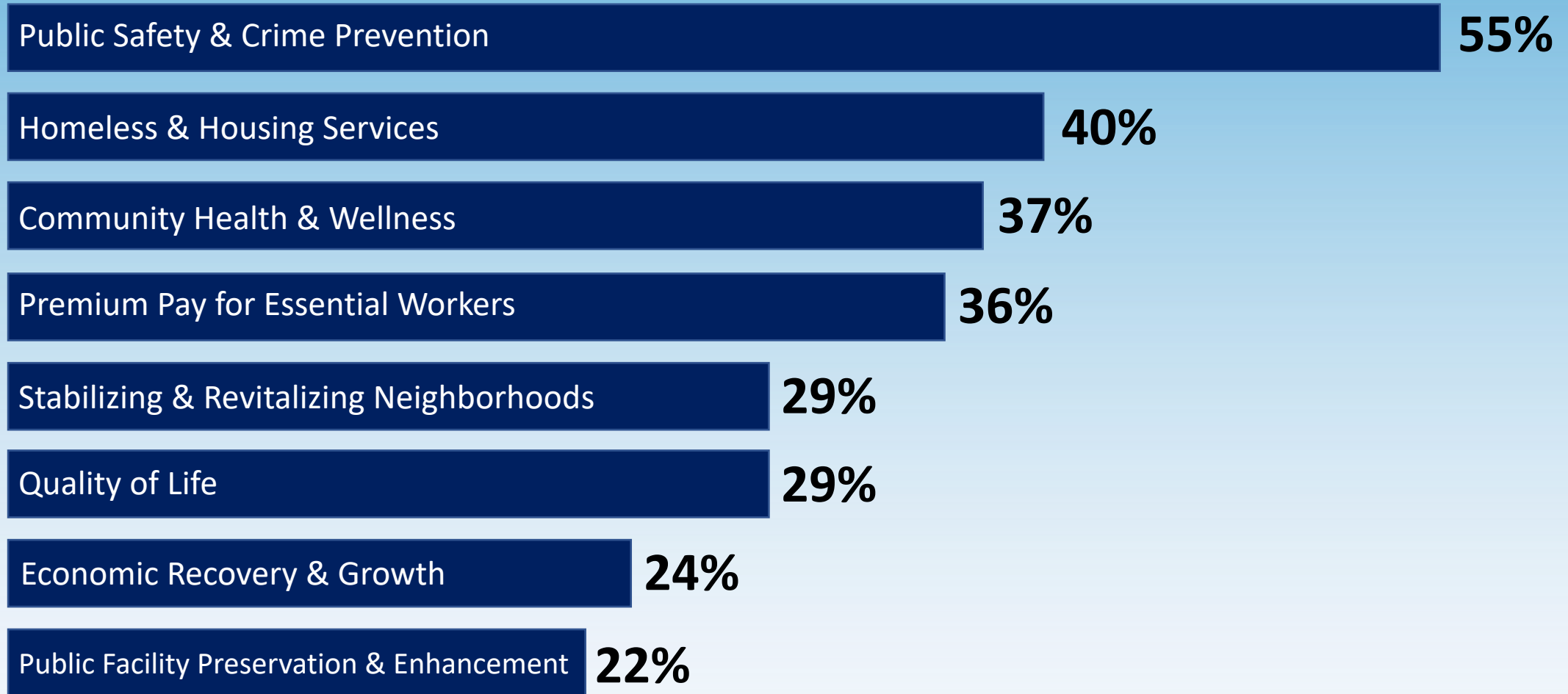
ARPA SURVEY RESULTS 2021



OVERVIEW

- A four-page questionnaire was mailed on Sept. 27, to 5,000 randomly selected households living within the city limits of Springfield.
- Results from the 2021 City of Springfield ARPA Survey are based on 1,438 completed questionnaires (1,237 mail and 201 online) of Springfield residents conducted during October of 2021. Overall findings have a +/- 2.6% of error (95% confidence interval).
- Using a 5-point scale, residents were asked how much of a priority the Springfield City Council should place on each of eight ARPA funding categories. (#1 rating being the highest priority and #5 being the lowest priority)

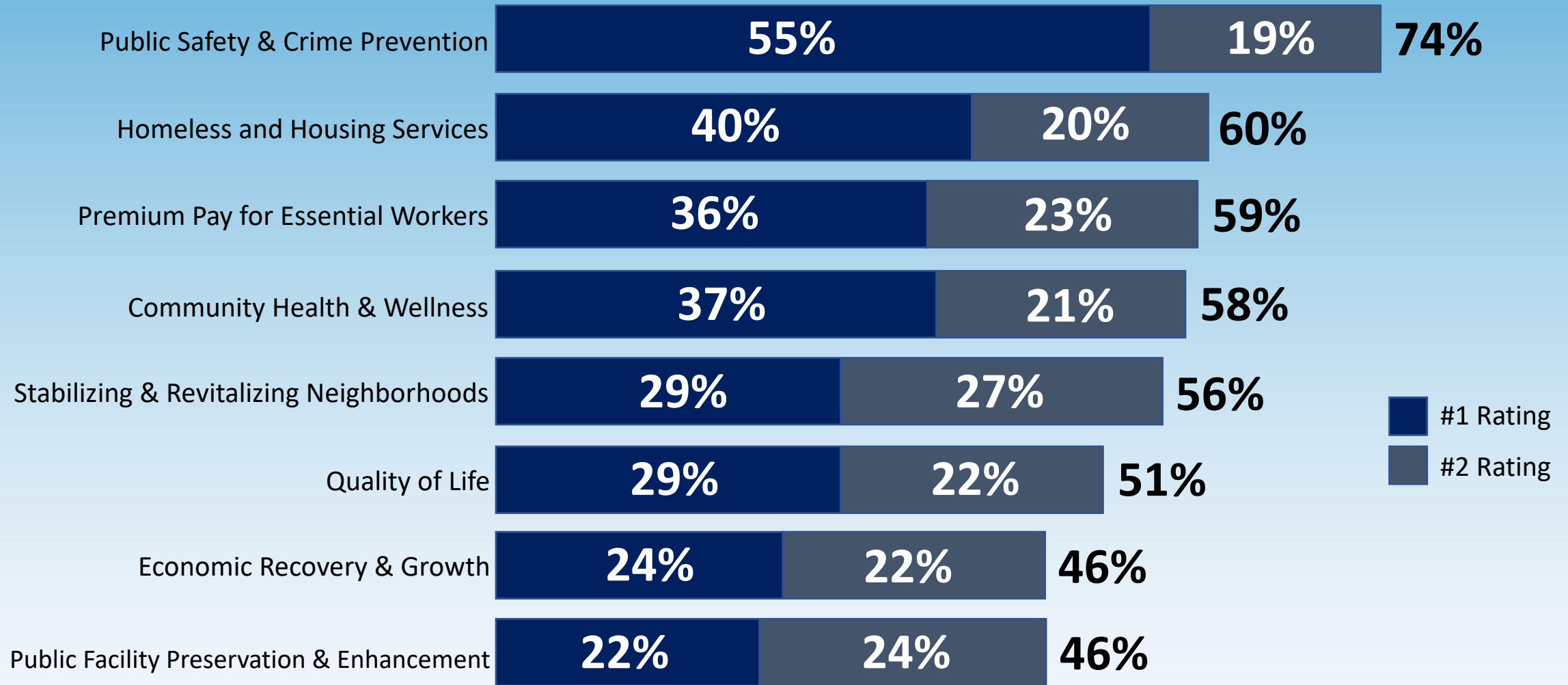
