6 WHEREAS, Resolution No. 9897 directed the City Manager to work with community  
7 groups, Council members, and citizens to develop a list of potential task force members to serve  
8 on a Stormwater Management Task Force and to present such list to the Council for  
9 consideration; and

11 WHEREAS, the City Manager proposes, for Councils' consideration and approval, the  
12 individuals listed on the attached "Exhibit A" to serve on the Stormwater Management Task  
13 Force.

15 NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF  
16 SPRINGFIELD, MISSOURI, as follows, that:  
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18 Section 1 - The individuals, or their designees, listed on "Exhibit A" are hereby appointed  
19 to the Stormwater Management Task Force.  
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21 Section 2 - The City Manager, or his designee, is hereby authorized to take any and all  
22 necessary actions in accordance with Resolution No. 9897 to carry out the intent and purpose of  
23 the Stormwater Management Task Force, including filling any vacancies on the Task Force.

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**EXPLANATION TO COUNCIL BILL NO. 2012 - 268**

ORIGINATING DEPARTMENT: Public Works

PURPOSE: To present a list of proposed members of the Stormwater Management Task Force to City Council for its approval.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION: The Stormwater Management Task Force was established by City Council in August 2011 for the purpose of gaining public input, representation, and collaboration in developing guidelines for stormwater management standards and policies for the City of Springfield. The Task Force was initiated, in part, as a result of more stringent enforcement interpretations of the Clean Water Act (CWA) by both the United States Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) and the Missouri Department of Natural Resources (MNR). Resolution No. 9897 authorized and directed the City Manager to work with community groups, Council members, and citizens to develop a list of potential members of the Stormwater Management Task Force.

Shortly after Council's authorization of the Stormwater Management Task Force, the EPA issued Total Maximum Daily Loads (TMDL) for Pearson, Wilson and Jordan Creeks requiring significant reduction of stormwater runoff into the creeks. The TMDLs were difficult, if not impossible, to meet and resulted in the City filing an appeal of the TMDLs. The appeal resulted in a delay of the issuance of the Municipal Separate Storm Sewer System (MS4) Permit, which resulted in a delay in the implementation of the Stormwater Management Task Force. Subsequently, in July 2012, the 1/8-Cent Parks/Waterways Sales Tax expired.


In light of recent regulatory events and the sunset of the 1/8-Cent Parks/Waterways Sales Tax, implementation of the Stormwater Management Task Force is timely and vital. The Stormwater Management Task Force will provide valuable community input, representation and collaboration in developing such guiding principles, priorities, policies and funding options for managing stormwater issues.

A list of members has been developed and is being presented to Council for its approval. The Public Works Department and the City are committed to good stewardship of regional water resources as they are essential to our environment and economic development.
